

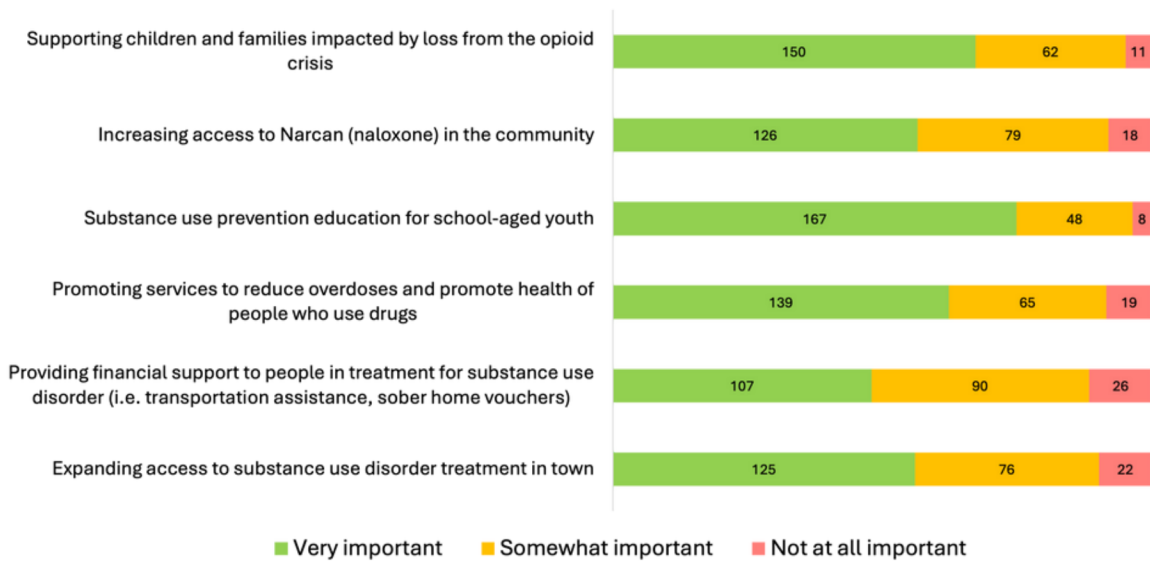

Opioid Settlement Survey Results

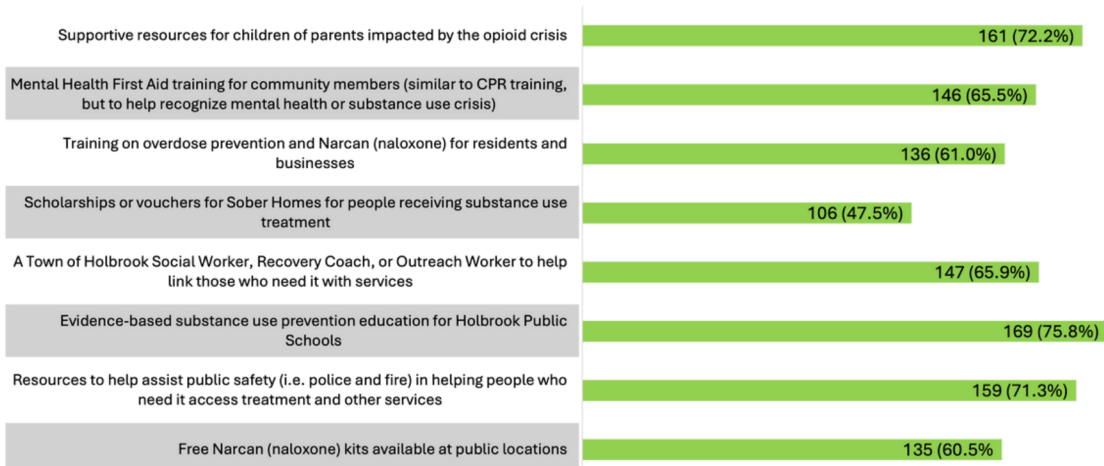
Background:

Holbrook's Opioid Settlement Advisory Committee gathered community input to inform how to use the town's opioid settlement funds, which originate from lawsuits against pharmaceutical companies, distributors, and pharmacies involved in the opioid crisis. To ensure the funds are used wisely, the Committee conducted a survey to gather feedback from residents on their preferences. Survey results are shared below.

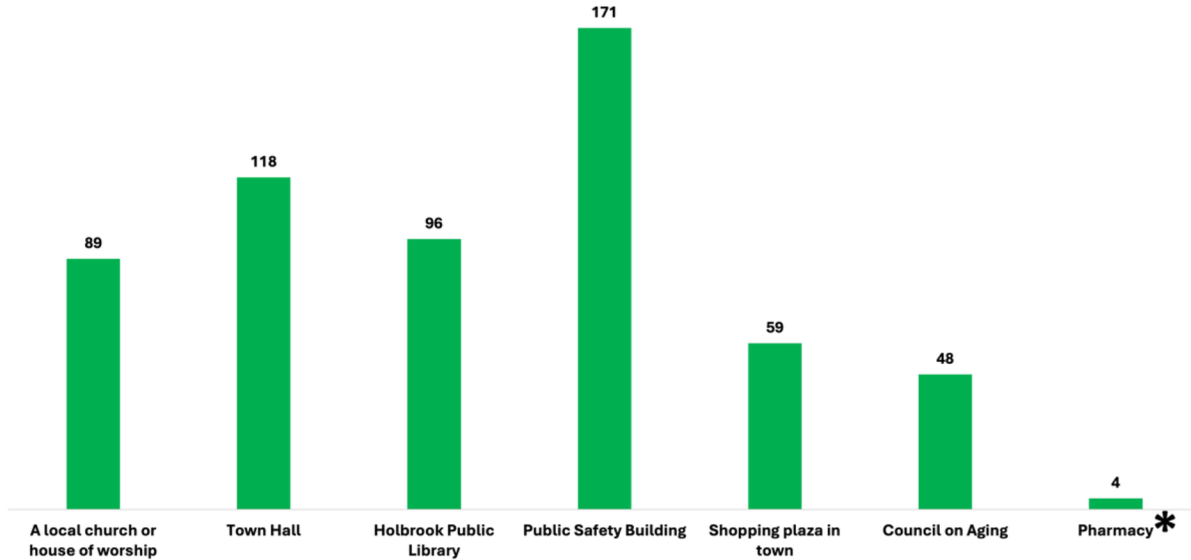
How important do you think the following approaches are when using opioid settlement funds?

If you could access Narcan (naloxone) for free in town, where would you feel comfortable doing so?



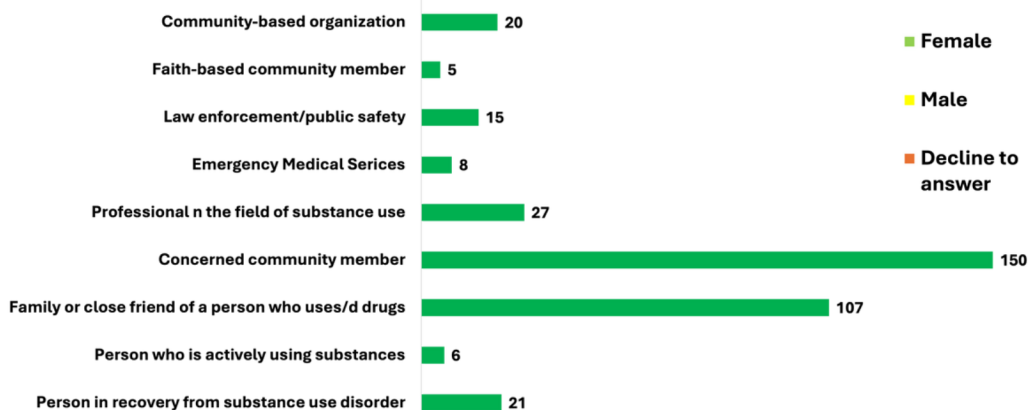
Other Suggestions

- *Pharmacy was not a survey choice, but was the most frequently mentioned suggestion

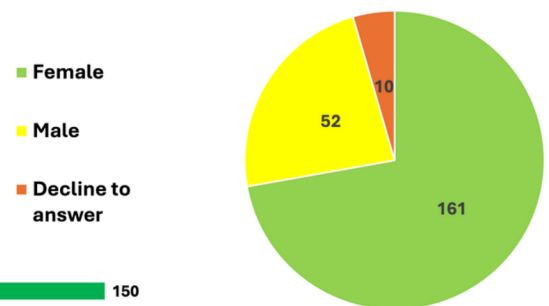
Who responded to the survey?

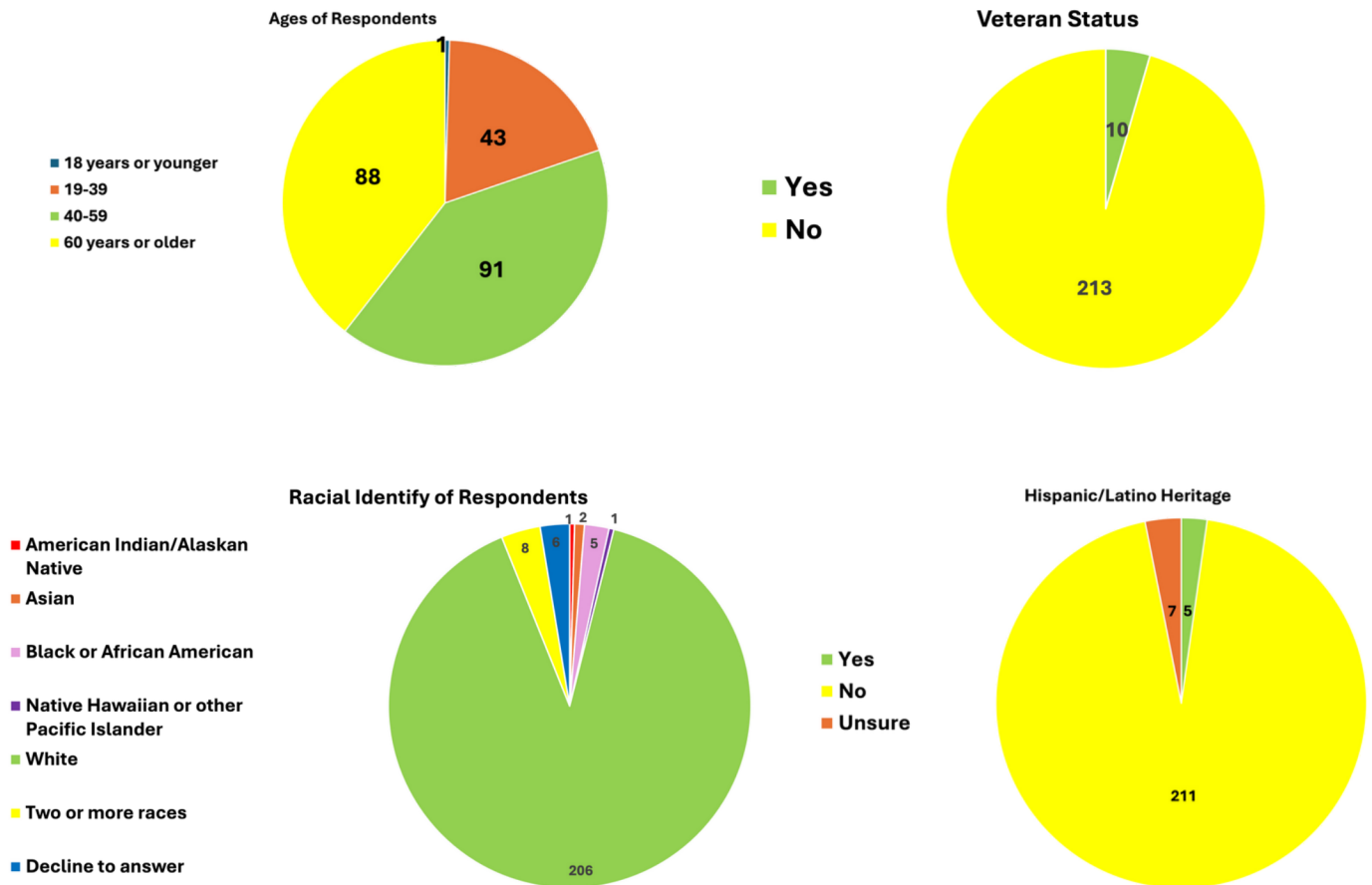
Which of following describe your personal/professional experience? (select all that apply)

Who responded to the survey?



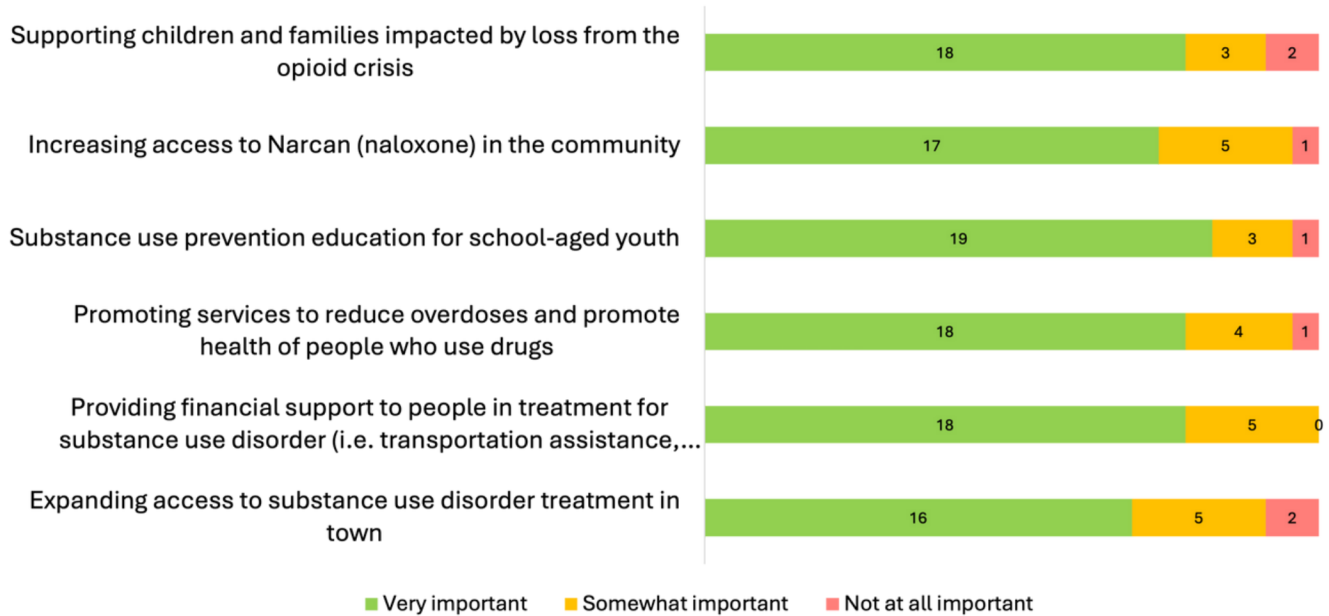
The Opioid Settlement Advisory Committee collected demographics of those responding to the survey in order to identify what groups of people the survey may have missed.

- **Non-English speaking** residents
